Guidelines and Entry Requirements

Applicants must:

- Complete the Google entry form
- Upload a signed guardian consent form
- Create and upload a 1-2 minute introductory video to showcase their own presentation skills (see below for details)

The Google entry form will require the following:

- Student contact information
- The name, job title, and company/organization of the person the student would like to interview
- Acceptance of our standards of conduct and professionalism
- The name and email address of a teacher or adult sponsor who knows about this competition and is supportive of the student's entry
- A private YouTube link to a 1-2 minute introductory video or upload of the video in an .mp4 or .mov file; the introductory video should be done by the student and should:
 - Introduce the student
 - \circ ~ Tell us why the student wants to do the interview
 - Tell us why the student thinks he or she would be good at doing an interview to be included in the *Career Journeys* video series

Entries must be submitted by **October 10, 2020**, either via the Google form or by email. Questions should be directed to Vicki Corwin at <u>vcorwin@tcfpe.org</u>.

Selection Process

Consortium staff will review all entries and choose the winners based on three selection criteria:

- Content: answers the three questions above in a compelling and concise way
- *Technical quality*: audio and video are clear
- *Professional Presence:* (e.g., no holes in clothing, no slouching, and speaking clearly and loudly enough to be heard and understood)

Students who are selected to record an interview will be notified by October 31, 2020, and then will then have until November 21 to submit their recorded interview for editing.
